Self-Advocate Creates Online Accessibility Tool!

The Arc Tennessee now features the Recite Me toolbar on all websites

Over 30 years ago, President George W. Bush signed into law the Americans with Disabilities Act, mandating important accessibility standards that continue to improve and protect the quality of life for individuals with disabilities. The ADA set an entirely new standard when it came to employment, transportation and public accommodations. Yet over the last 18 months, as the world goes in and out of quarantine due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and spends more time at home, attention is now to turned to virtual accessibility.

"The Arc Tennessee is such a leader when it comes to advocacy for the disability community. Yet when we were all sent home to work remotely and connect with the community, it was challenging," explains Heather Henderson, Director of Advocacy for The Arc Tennessee. "We have strong resources, yet when it came to conveying that online and in a way that individuals and families could easily navigate, we recognized significant room for improvement."

Within the last 7 months, The Arc Tennessee team has launched four websites, each now featuring the Recite Me accessibility toolbar! Recite Me is an innovative cloud-based software that lets visitors to a website view and use it in the way that works best for them. We have added the Recite Me web accessibility and language toolbar to all four websites to make it accessible and inclusive for as many people as possible.

The accessibility toolbar helps many people, including individuals with common conditions like sight loss and dyslexia. It also meets the needs of

non-English speakers. The world of services and support in the disability sector is already complex.

"Navigating the disability sector is challenging, especially in a second language," says Heidi Haines, Executive Director of The Arc Tennessee. "We don't want language translation to be a barrier, especially given the diversity represented throughout the state," Haines explains.

Recite Me was founded by Ross Linnett, a selfadvocate in Europe who was diagnosed with dyslexia in college. You can open the Recite Me language and accessibility toolbar by clicking on the Language & Accessibility button, located in the top left-hand corner of each website published by The Arc Tennessee.

After you click on the Language & Accessibility button, the Recite Me toolbar opens and displays a range of different options. See page five for a complete guide to using the toolbar.

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Screen Reader

The Screen reader helps people who are visually impaired or neuro-divergent to perceive and understand your digital content.







Key features include:

- All content read aloud in a natural voice
 - 35 different language options
 - Voice speed controls
 - Word by word highlighting

Translation

Translate all website content into 100 languages, including 35 text to speech voices.



Styling

Customize website content in a way that works best for you. Recite Me supports people who are dyslexic, visually impaired or have a learning disability to change the way a website looks









Key features include

- Text size, color and font. Including Open-Dyslexic
- Website background color
- Link, ruler and screen mask colors

Reading Support

Reading content online can be a challenge for some people. To simplify and support, Recite Me provides the following tools:













Plain text - All styling is stripped away, leaving only text, much like a document.

Ruler - Read line by line with no without being distracted with other text or images.

Reading Mask - Mask away 90% of the website, leaving only the information you want to concentrate on, at one time.

Magnifier - As if a magnifying glass is in your hand, zoom in to sections of text to read more clearly.

Margins - When in text only mode, you can use the margin feature to position content in the best place for you.

Dictionary - Website visitors have access to a fully integrated dictionary and thesaurus.






Sept. 11th Remembrance Project Art Contest WINNERS!





